Other Business:

Meals on Wheels: Jean Macnicol, Meals and Wheels co-ordinator for the Arrowtown region, said she had a really good team of drivers at present but it was good to have one or two extras to call on if needed. Drivers were only asked to deliver meals two or three times a year and there were usually between eight and twelve meals per trip.

Wasp Control: Russell Heckler gave his report regarding wasp eradication in Arrowtown. Wasp nest numbers had decreased considerably over the years. Only 26 this year compared with 124 for the 2016-17 period. The first nests used to appear in December but this year it was January. He expected his supply of poison would last at least another year.

Clean Air: Susan Rowley updated members on the latest NIWA Clean Air news. She said ORC has taken a secondary role in the meantime. There had been 7 or 8 monitors around Arrowtown and 15 in homes over the winter months and NIWA would put them back next year. There were continuing high levels of air pollution in winter and Susan suspected lots of holiday homes did not have upgraded burners. The time will come when Arrowtown needed to make the decision on what action should be taken to reduce the level to an acceptable standard. Peter Robinson mentioned Arrowtown was reported to be the dirtiest town in NZ in winter when it came to air pollution and it would take a huge reduction to meet the levels required.

General Business: Keith Milne thanked the committee for their work over the past year, especially Noel who he had nominated as Chairperson in 2017. He said Noel had been an excellent Chairperson working tirelessly for the AVA and he mentioned the many things Noel had done during the three years he was in office.

In coming president Susan Rowley said she totally agreed with everything Keith had said. Noel had been a dedicated AVA committee member and he could not have done more. He had developed the AVA profile and membership and instigated the AVA as being a vehicle for funding wilding pine, predator free and local tracks.

Susan also thanked Jean Britton who was stepping down from the committee.

Guest Speakers: Civil Defence members Dan Andrews and Craig Gibson gave an interesting power point presentation encouraging communities to set up first emergency response teams and explaining how they can assist in the process.
