Matters Arising:

- * Olive Leaf Building - No decision as of AVA meeting date
- * Arrowtown awarded Most Beautiful Small Town - Previous AVA Chairman Noel Beggs suggested writing a letter to thank the lady who nominated Arrowtown. Susan to do so
- * Drainage Issue at residential property on Centennial Ave- committee will forward correspondence to Heath Copeland to action. Susan will suggest to residents they take photos of the issue in the meantime

- * Treasurer requested full name, date of birth and address of two new committee members (a Charities Commission requirement, due to committee's charitable status).

Councillors Report.

- * APBA update
- * CBD plan - Traffic management discussion around car parking, etc in CBD. Suggestion was made to invite a representative from the APBA to come and speak at January AVA meeting
- * The idea of a "River Park" enhancement project in river area leading to Sawpit Gully is under discussion. APBA are engaging with council on a cohesive plan going forward, including an informal working bee tidy-up along with Arrowtown Choppers, which will consider rudimentary guiding of the creek, strategic placement of stepping stones to allow river crossing, and a channel cut through bush scrub below the skate park, to divert public away from the "boggy" area. It is being proposed to approach council for more funding support in the event of making more substantial changes

Aurora Energy Investment Plan

- * Commerce Commission stakeholders meeting re Aurora Energy Investment Plan. Peter attended and provided an update. Peter represented the AVA at public meetings on the subject. He observed strong opinions were expressed in the discussion around line power charges, and the community perception that the proposed charges are unfair. Different pricing plans are up for discussion, and the commerce commission are seeking feedback. David proposed ways the AVA could assist in ensuring the community have access to information. Submissions close on 10th Dec. Committee decided to advise people on AVA Facebook page. (Sara to put some wording together to advise the public of this). The possibility of carrying out a survey of members on pricing was raised, but it was decided there wasn't enough time to do so before 10th December.

General business:

- * Secretary role has been filled by Heidi McLeod
- * Deputy Chairman role - Daniel and Nick were both suggested for this position. TBC after further discussion
- * AVA Team Building Workshop feedback - this was well enjoyed, and a useful exercise for committee members. Thanks to Nick Fifield for organising

- * Nick Fifield proposed creating a Whats App group for AVA Committee member communication - committee member's phone numbers required for this. Committee was in favour of proceeding. Nick to organise
- * Contact from Bruce Patton regarding the growth of broom on the hillside above the battery monument at Millbrook end of Arrowtown, asking about an agreement with AVA and DOC to maintain this area. Susan will seek advice from Noel on what the understanding was previously
- * Daniel commented on Council's planting of trees and shrubs down the steps going down to the green, area looking attractive now. Questioned tendency of members of public parking vehicles right in front of policemen's hut, creating a visual barrier for photographs of the building, Daniel to look into this for next meeting. There appears to be a greater concentration of visitors in this area now with the construction of new businesses in this area.
